## FOR THE NINE MONTHS ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 2018

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The consolidated financial statements and highlights presented on pages 1 through 6 reflect the financial position, results of operations, and cash flows of Atrium Health's Obligated Group (referred to as Atrium Health) which includes controlled operations, divisions and health related entities (the Primary Enterprise) and Atrium Health Foundation. Although there are some affiliates of the Primary Enterprise that are not part of the Obligated Group, the statements presented herein represent the Obligated Group and, because there are no designated affiliates at this time, the Combined Group in all material respects.

#### Overview/Summary

For the nine months ended September 30, 2018, Atrium Health reported Earnings Before Interest, Taxes, Depreciation and Amortization (EBITDA) of \$517 million or 11.1% which was \$32 million above the prior year. Operating income of \$213 million or 4.6% was \$20 million ahead of the prior year.

## Comparative Statement of Operations-Actual versus Prior Year (pg.5)

Net patient revenue was \$159 million or 3.9% above the first nine months of 2017 primarily due to the impact of net reimbursement increases, additional governmental payer settlements and growth in patient acuity and some specific patient volumes. Bedded discharges were 1.7% greater than the prior year, although inpatient discharges were 2.3% above 2017. Outpatient surgery, endoscopy procedures, and radiology procedures experienced 0.1%, 7.3%, and 3.4% growth respectively. Emergency room visits were 1.8% below the first nine months of 2017, although Medical Group urgent care and virtual visits grew 2.7%, suggesting that patients are choosing more appropriate, and affordable, care locations. Total Medical Group patient visits grew 0.1% from September 30, 2017, driven primarily by provider growth. Governmental payer settlements and additional 2018 North Carolina Medicaid supplemental payment program revenues contributed to net patient revenue growth. As a result of the more rapid growth of both Medicare Advantage and traditional Medicare relative to the growth of other payers, Atrium Health has experienced an increase in Medicare payer mix.

Other operating revenue was \$40 million or 9.6% above the first nine months of 2017 due primarily to growth in retail sales of specialty pharmaceuticals.

Unreimbursed charges as a percent of gross revenue increased from 8.4% at September 30, 2017 to 8.5% through the first nine months of 2018.

Total personnel costs increased \$54 million or 2.1%. Salaries growth in the first nine months was a result of market and performance-based salary adjustments and an increase in Medical Group providers and changes in the provider compensation model, which took full effect in the second half of 2017, but was offset to some degree by decreases in total personnel, primarily as a result of increased clinical labor productivity and workforce efficiencies in non-clinical areas. Benefits cost increased at a higher rate than salaries primarily due to higher health claims costs per Atrium Health team member in 2018.

Supplies expense was \$46 million or 6.1% above the first nine months of 2017 due primarily to increased pharmaceutical costs, primarily in retail specialty pharmaceuticals and hospital neurology infusion and oncology drugs, and, to a lesser extent, higher implant volumes, and routine inflationary increases.

Professional fees increased \$26 million or 26.7% due to increases in legal and marketing fees. Purchased services expense increased \$24 million or 7.9% due to higher software and equipment maintenance costs and lease and management fees paid to a new anesthesia services provider. Other operating expense was \$13 million or 7.8% above the prior year, due to higher professional liability costs and Medicaid supplemental payment program assessments.

#### Comparative Balance Sheet (pg.4)

The Obligated Group's total unrestricted cash position, including investments designated for capital improvements, increased approximately \$285 million from June 30 due primarily to cash provided by operations (\$329 million) and favorable investment income including changes in the market value of investments during the quarter (\$99 million), offset by capital spending (\$99 million) and debt service (\$37 million). As a result, days cash on hand increased to 325 from 309 days at June 30, 2018.

Other accounts receivable decreased \$13 million or 9.3% from June 30 largely due to the receipt of semiannual sales and use tax refunds (\$10 million).

The \$209 million increase in Investments Designated for Capital Improvements reflects \$120 million of contributions and favorable investment income including changes in the market value of investments during the third quarter.

Salaries and benefits payable increased \$89 million or 30.6% from June 30 due to the timing of pay periods and monthly accruals for teammate retirement plan payments that are funded annually.

Other liabilities and accruals increased \$13 million or 7% due primarily to third quarter accruals for annual incentive pay for non-physician

teammates.

Estimated third-party payer settlements increased \$17 million or 7.9% primarily as a result of 2018 Medicaid supplemental payment program proceeds received in the third quarter along with routine cost report reserves.

Pension liability decreased \$10 million or 2.8% as a result of \$10 million of planned contributions to the pension plan during the third quarter.

Interest rate swap liability and Deferred inflows of resources decreased by \$15 million each as a result of increases in interest rates.

## Comparative Statement of Cash Flows (pg.6)

Net cash provided by operating activities (\$606 million) provided the major source of cash for the first nine months of 2018. Significant uses of cash were for the Obligated Group's capital expenditures (\$282 million), debt service (\$112 million) and additions to investments limited as to use (\$139 million).

## Non-Operating Activity (pg.5)

Net non-operating activity, which consists primarily of investment results, including unrealized gains and losses, was \$335 million less than the nine months ended September 30, 2017. The return on investments designated for capital improvements was 2.4%, compared to 11.7% for the nine months ended September 30,2017.
